- 1. You must stop at traffic light signals and road signs.
- 2. Before setting off, turning right or left, or stopping, you must look behind and make sure it is safe.
- 3. Look and then give a clear arm signal.
- 4. When turning from one road to another, pedestrians who are crossing that road have the priority, so give way.
- 5. You must stop for pedestrians at zebra crossings.
- 6. You must stop for the red light at traffic lights, including those at crossings.
- 7. Always wear a correctly fitted helmet.
- 8. Make sure you are dressed in the right clothes: light, bright, flourescent, reflective.
- 9. Use your eyes and ears all the time.
